## **Vision :-**

To provide quality legal education and training to the student to sub serve the basic legal necessities of the common, poor, marginalized sections of the society and to participate actively in to the administration of justice for the restitution of constitutional, humanitarian and statutory rights.

## **BRIEF HISTORY OF INSTITUTION:-**

Our parental institution was established in 1934, by Late Karmaveer Dr. Mamasahab Jagdale as Shri Shivaji Maratha Boarding and renamed as a Shri Shivaji Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Barshi in 1946. The Sanstha aims at imparting liberal and vocational education up to the University level. Embossing Social, Cultural, Scientific, Medical, Agricultural, Commercial, Legal, Industrial, Education & Physical Education to the raising generation of India in general, Maharashtra in particular, irrespective of Caste Creed, gender, religion. "Let us help one another and March on a righteous path" is our Motto.

At present the Sanstha runs Eight Colleges, Fourteen High-Schools, Four Primary Schools, Two Pre-Primary Schools, Two Boardings, One well equipped Hospital with 300 Beds.

Rajarshi Shahu Evening Law College, Barshi, was established in 1972 with the permission / approval of the Govt. of Maharashtra. It is recognised by the Bar Council of India, New Delhi. The college was first affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur and thereafter it is affiliated to P.A.H.Solapur University, Solapur from the Academic year 2004-05.

The college has been conducting the Three Year law course since its establishment and the Five Years' Law Course since 1999-2000.

The college was assessed by the NAAC, Banglore in July, 2004 and accredited with C<sup>+</sup> Grade.

## OBJECT:-

The college was established with an object to increase legal awareness and impart quality based legal education in Barshi and neighbouring areas.

The college aims at producing competent professional law graduates by training students skills like communication, legal writing, argumentative skill, analytical ability and skill for decision making which are strongly needed for legal profession.

## COURSES OFFERED:-

The Law Degree Courses are as under:-

### 1) LL. B. ( Three Years Course):-

This course is of three years' duration, LL. B. degree will be awarded after passing the Three Years LL. B. examinations conducted by the University.

### 2) Five Year B. A. LL. B. Integrated Course-

This course is of five years duration. The students admitted to this course will be awarded B. A. LL. B Degree after passing 5 years LL. B. Examination conducted by university.

To be a law practitioner, the Degree of LL. B. is a must. The student completing Third Year LL. B. or Fifth Year B.A.LL.B can obtain a " SANAD" from the State Bar Council and is entitled to practise in any court of India after passing BAR Council of India's Examination.

## RULES RELATING TO ADMISSION

### A) Eligibility for Admission to 3 year LL. B. Course:-

- 1) 1<sup>st</sup> Semester:- For Admission to the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester of 3 year LL. B. Course, a student must have passed Bachelor's Degree Examination in any Faculty of a recognised University with minimum 45% of marks (including Grace Marks) at the qualifying examination. However the above percentage of marks will be 40% for the students belonging to SC / ST categories. Admission will be in given Accordance with the Merit in MAH- CET Law examination.

Explanation:- The Applicants who have obtained 10+2 or Graduation / Post graduation through open University system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission in the law course.

- 2) 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Semester:- A student for being eligible for admission to the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Semester must have successfully kept the terms for the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> Semester respectively irrespective of the result of these Semester examination.
- 3) 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester:- A student for being eligible for admission to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester must have either passed in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester or must have got exemption in at least seven Papers of the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester.
- 4) 5<sup>th</sup> Semester:- A student being eligible for admission to the 5<sup>th</sup> Semester must have either passed in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Semester or must have got exemption in at least seven papers of the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Semester.

**B) Eligibility for Admission to 5 year B. A. LL. B. Course:-**

- 1) **1<sup>st</sup> Semester:-** For Admission to the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester of Five years B. A. LL. B. Degree Course, a student must have passed H. S. C. Examination ( 10+2 Pattern ) or equivalent qualification with minimum 45% of marks at the qualifying examination. However the above percentage of marks will be 40 % for the student belonging to SC / ST categories. Admission will be given in accordance with merit in MAH CET examination.  
**Explanation:-** The Applicants who have obtained 10 + 2 or Graduation / Post graduation through open university system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission in the law course.
- 2) **2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Semester:-** A student being eligible for admission to the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Semester must have successfully kept the terms for the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Semester respectively, irrespective of the result of these Semester examinations.
- 3) **3<sup>rd</sup> Semester:-** A student for being eligible for admission to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester must have either passed in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester or must have got exemption in at least Four Papers of the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester.
- 4) **5<sup>th</sup> Semester:-** A student being eligible for admission to the 5<sup>th</sup> Semester must have either passed in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Semester or must have got exemption in at least Four papers of the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Semester.
- 5) **7<sup>th</sup> Semester:-** A student being eligible for admission to the 7<sup>th</sup> Semester must have either passed in the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Semester or must have got exemption in at least Seven Papers of the 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Semester.
- 6) **9<sup>th</sup> Semester:-** A student being eligible for admission to the 9<sup>th</sup> Semester must have either passed in the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> semester or must have got exemption in at least Six Papers of 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Semester.

- 9) Migration Certificate - In the case of students migrating from other Universities, the student should submit their Migration Certificate at the time of the Admission or within 15 days thereafter. These Students should submit duly filled Eligibility Application Form at the time of the admission along with the Eligibility Fee. If the Eligibility Certificate of the student is not received from the University by the end of the First Term, because of any incompleteness in filling in the Eligibility form or incomplete documents submitted by the students, then the admission of such student will be cancelled.
- 10) Education gap certificate if there is a gap in studies from qualifying examination.

## RULES RELATING TO SEMESTER - SYSTEM

### LL.B Three Year & B.A., LL.B Five Year Law Course

- 1) The Three Year LL.B. Degree Course shall be of Six Semester Full Time Course leading to LL.B. Degree. The integrated Five Year B.A. LLB Degree Course shall be of Ten Semester Full Time Course Leading to B.A., LL.B. Degree
- 2) No candidate will be admitted to the Semester Examination unless he has 75% attendance in lectures delivered in the given Semester in each Subject.
- 3) There shall be examination at the end of each semester.
- 4) For CBCS pattern each Theory paper of each semester will carry 70/80 marks and will be of two & half hours durations. & 30/20 marks for continuous assessments as per internal evaluation.
- 5) No Students shall be allowed to simultaneously register for a law degree programme with any other granduate or postgraduate course run by the same or any other university or institute for academic or professional learning.
- 6) **Internship:**
  - A) Each registered student shall have to complete minimum of 12 weeks Internship for Three Years LL.B. Degree Course stream and 20 weeks in case of Five Year Integrated B.A., LL.B. Course stream during the entire period of Legal studies under NGO, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Law firms, Companies, Local Self Government. Provided that Internship in any year cannot be for a continuous period of more than Four Weeks and all Students shall at least have gone through once in the entire academic period with Trial and Appellate Advocates.
  - B) Each student shall keep Internship Diary to be evaluated by the guide in Internship and Core Faculty members of the Staff each time. The total marks shall be assessed in the final Semester in Moot Court Exercise and Internship Course.

- 7) The Student shall write prescribed number of tutorials / Assignments / Case Comment / Project Report/Seminar Paper
- 8) The Student shall appear and attend academic discussions/Debates / Seminars,
- 9) The Student shall have to appear for the mid term or other Examinations of the college.
- 10) The Student shall attend prescribed Practical Training programmes including Legal Aid Clinic, Lok Adalat, court visits, moot courts, office visits & internship programmes etc.

**11) Standard of Passing:**

**A) FOR CBCS Pattern**

1. A candidate shall be declared to have passed in the semester examination if he has obtained not less than 40 marks (28 external university, 12 in internal examination) in each paper & not less than an aggregate of 50% of Marks in all the papers of Semester examination.
2. A Candidate may be exempted from appearing in paper or papers of each semester in which he has secured not less than 50% marks.
3. A student who failed in University semester examination (Theory) and passed internal examination of paper (subject)) shall be given FC Grade. Such student will have to appear for term end examination only. A student who failed in internal examination and passed in University Examination (Theory) shall be given FR Grade. Such student will have to appear for term end examination as well as internal examination.
- 12) All the Semester Examinations will be conducted twice in a year i.e. October/November and March/April.
- 13) The LL.B. and B.A., LL.B. Degree will not be conferred upon a candidate unless the candidate has passed in all the Papers prescribed for each Semester Examination.
- 14) The College may be allowed to admit students for the entire academic Year i.e. for both the Semester during the Academic Year at one time.
- 15) To pass any of the Semester Examination, a student must have passed in all the papers of that Semester.
- 16) The results of the candidate appearing at 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Semester of Five Year Integrated B.A., LL.B. Degree Course shall not be declared unless and until the candidate has been declared 'Pass' in all the papers up to 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Semester respectively.
- 17) The result of the candidate appearing at the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Semester of Three Year LL.B. Degree Course shall not be declared unless and until the candidate has been declared 'Pass' in all the papers up to 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Semester respectively.

## RULES OF DISCIPLINE

(To be followed by students)

- 1) The students must maintain silence. They must not loiter in the passage corridors during lectures. They must read quietly in the Library and spend their spare time in such a way that it should not cause any interference with the work of others. Absolute silence must invariably be preserved in the Library as well as in the classrooms. Anybody found guilty of breach of this rule will be severely dealt with.
  - 2) A student enrolled in this college to any law course must attend 75 percent of the total lectures delivered in the academic year according to the rules of the Bar Council of India. If he fails to keep minimum attendance required, his examination form will not be forwarded to the university.
  - 3) Students are required to attend functions celebrating Days of National Importance.
  - 4) It shall be binding on the part of the students to see that no damage is done to the property of the college in any manner.
  - 5) The students shall behave with their classmates, teachers' authorities and the Non-Teaching employees of the college in responsible manner.
  - 6) The students involved in any attempts of common-offs, vulgarism, gundaism, man-handling, Ragging, eve-teasing, malpractices or participation in criminal acts shall be liable for punishment.
  - 7) Mobile phones should be switched off or kept in silent mode in the library, class rooms & in the office.
  - 8) No candidate will be allowed to appear at the Third Year LL. B. examination of the three year law course and fifth year examination of the five years law course unless he has completed his tutorial work & Internal Examinations.
  - 9) No society or association of the students of the college will be permitted to be formed without the prior permission of the Principal.
  - 10) No meeting or other activity shall be allowed in the college without the prior permission of the Principal.
  - 11) No person shall be invited to address the college students or the members of any students society without prior permission of the Principal.
  - 12) All subjects of debates or items of entertainment in the college are to be approved by the Principal.
  - 13) Student should not indulge in malpractice during internal tests & not to be absent from Internal Examinations.
  - 14) Student should follow dress code in the college as prescribed by the Principal.
- i) **Dress Code:-** Dress code is compulsory for all the Students in the college on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday of the week.  
(Dress Code shall consist of - Black TROUSER & White Shirt for Male And Black Salwar & White Kurta with Dupatta of Black colour for Female)
- ii) **I - Card is Must:-**  
I - Card should compulsorily wear around the neck, during the College hours in the college.

15) "Ragging" within or outside the college premises Ragging in any form is prohibited. The student who commits ragging will be restituted from the college immediately. Such student will be prosecuted under the Maharashtra prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 and if convicted is liable for the punishment of imprisonment which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to fine which may extended to ten thousand rupees. Ragging means display of disorderly conduct; doing of any act which causes or is likely to casue physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear of shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes- i) teasing, abusing, threatening or Playing Practical Jokes on, or causing hurt to, such students or ii) asking a student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course, willingly do.

17) **Women's Cell :-**

As per the guidelines of The Sexual Harassment of women at workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act 2013, and P.A.H. Solapur University Solapur, womens cell is established in the college to provide Gender Justice

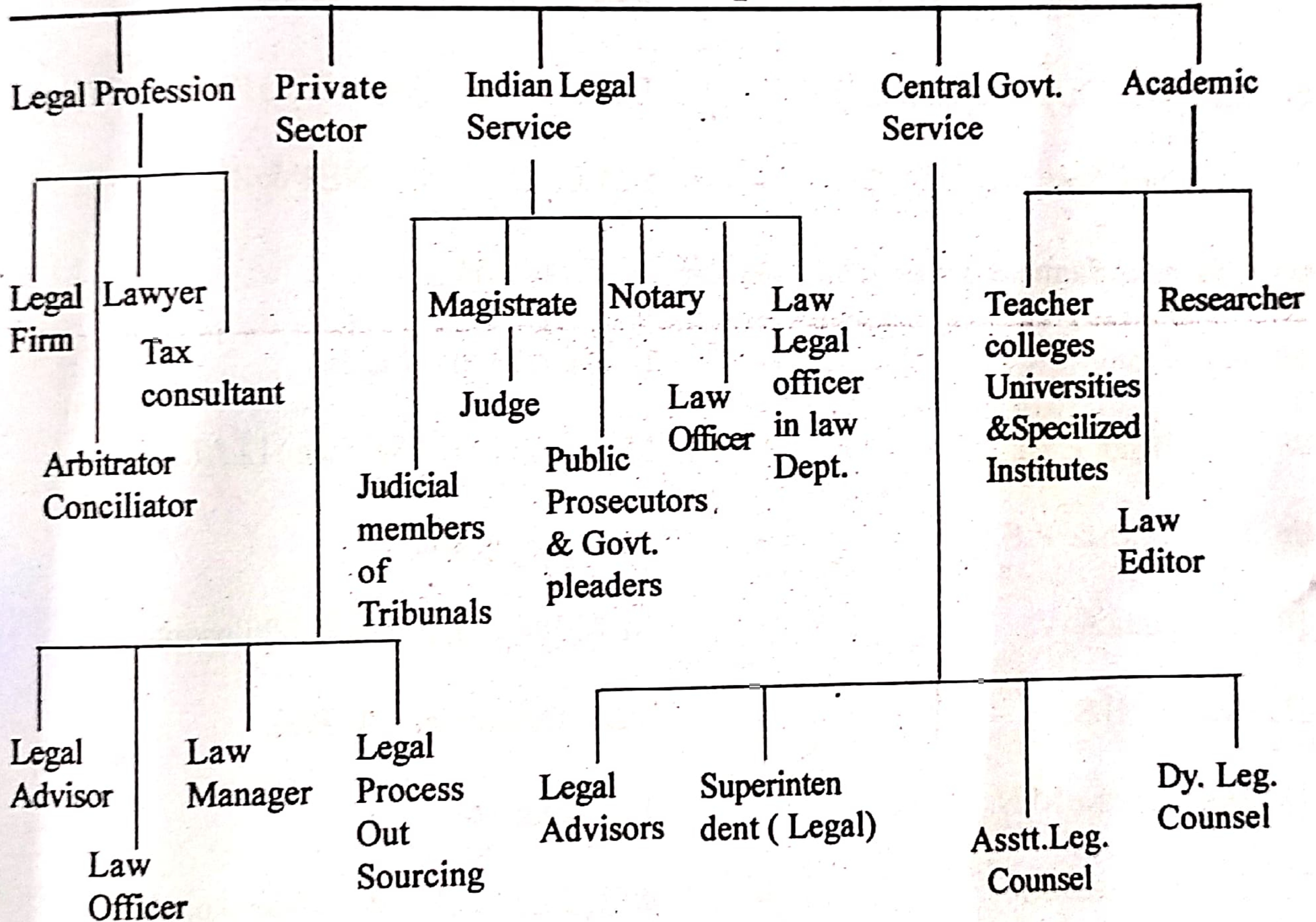
